She's not like anyone I've ever seen before, and if I'm not like anyone anyone's ever seen before, are she and I a we?


Nervously, I nod to her.

I pushed open the door which didn't make a sound. Inside was Hazel. It was definitely her. But she wasn't like I'd ever known her.





Climate Change 101

Before we get into the impacts of climate change, and all of the ways they're already making life on Earth more difficult, it's a good idea to first discuss what climate change is, how it works, and why manking is not into a lot worse.

Depending on how good your science classes were (and how well you remember them), some of what's included in this chapter might be more of a refisher than new information. But the unfortunate reality is that not everyone has had access to good information. Science denial is big business — companies that benefit from it have spent many years and many millions of dollars trying to speead skepticism, and social-media algorithms have made it really easy for bad actors to pass along lies and misleading information. (Don't worry, we'll debunk a lot of that throughout this book.) While this chapter can't help but be a quick overview, it's worth briefly explaining the science. Climate change is real. Humans are causing most of it and are making it substantially worse. And even in a

best-case scenario, it's going to dramatically change the way we live. It's a shame that all needs to be said, but so it goes.

If summers feel warmer to you now than they did when you were a little kid, that's not your memory playing tricks on you. As of 2019, the twenty hottest years on record in human history have all happened in the last twenty-two years. That's not all. The ten hottest of those years have all happened since 1998, and the nine hottest since 2005. The five most recent full years for which data exist, 2014. 2018, are also the top five when it comes to hottest temperature.

And in 2018, the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (more about it shortly) warned that the worst impacts of climate change will definitely hit if we allow the planet to get more than 2.7 degrees hotter than it was before the Industrial Revolution started. After over thirty-five days as sea, sailing more than 8.000 nautical miles in some of the wold's roughest conditions, the men never give up. The dog drivers lash the sleds and assemble the gear for travel over the Antarcic terrain. Wood lottles such as pants, publica, and eight pairs of gloves are distributed. The open water abruptly ends and the "Barrier" appears from the Bay of Whales. The massive Ross Ice Shelf "Barrier" stands at 150 to 200 feet all at the highest place. A Public Health Epidemic

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the US government organization responsible for monitoring health, considers sleep disorders such as insomnia a public health epid because they affect so many Americans. Insomnia is a sleep disorder characterized by an inability to get enough sleep. Insomnia can lead to sleep deprivation, but sleep deprivation can also be caused by choices a person makes, such as staying up late studying for a test. When you do that, you don't necessarily have insomnia, but you are sleep deprived.

Sleep deprivation can lead to poor performance during the day, especially at school or work. Inadequate sleep for any reason also leads to mental health issues such as anxiety, depression, and stress. And for a few people, not getting enough sleep can be downright dangerous. People may have serious car accidents if they drive while drowsy. Just like driving while drunk, drowsiness slows reaction time and leads to poor decision-making on the road. The National Safety Council estimates that drivers under the age of twenty-five are involved in at least 50 percent of the estimated six thousand fatal crashes each year related to drowsy driving.

Lack of sleep can lead to medical issues such as heart problems, diabetes, obesity, and high blood pressure. Insufficient sleep is suspected of being an early sign of Alzheimer's disease-a brain disease that leads to memory loss and dementia that is ultimately fatal. Sleep deprivation can even cause sleepwalking with fatal consequences, such as driving a car off a bridge or falling down the stairs.


We all need to make sleep a priority in our lives according to Dr. Timothy Morgenthaler, a past president of the American Academy of Sleep Medicine. "Healthy sleep is essential for physical health, mental well-being, and personal and public safety," he said. "Sleep is a necessity, not a luxury, and the promotion of healthy sleep should be a fundamental public health priority."







about it. For one thing, its brightness changes as it orbits Saturn. It seems twice as bright during half of its orbit as it does during the other half. The only explanation scientistic scould think of was that half of lapetus was almost black and the other half almost white. When the dark side is facing Earth, lapetus looks dim. When the light side is facing Earth, lapetus looks bright.

The first photos of laperus taken by the spacecraft Voyage 2 in 1981 revealed that laperus is indeed nearly half black and half white, with a sharp. Schaped dividing line between the two halves. The little moun looks a lot like the Chinese black-and-white yin-yang symbol. Scientisis aren't certain why laperus looks this way. One theory is that dark material blows from the near outermost moon, Photobe, due to meteoroid impacts. The dark material then falls toward Saturn. Since laperus is between Photobe and Saturn, it might sweep up some of this material. But no one has confirmed this. laperus had some other surprises waiting for the Voyger researchers, notably the mountain range on lapetus's equator. The ridge is an almost perfectly straight line and makes the moon look something like a walnut, or as though lapetus were made in two halves that were squashed together. The mountain range is at least 800 miles (1,300 km) long, wrapping one-third of the way around the moon. The peaks of the range are up os 8 miles (13 km) high, 3 miles (5 km) higher than the highest mountains on Earth, which is impressive for a moon only 914 miles (1,471 km) wide. No one knows what formed this weird-looking mountain range. Several ideas have been proposed. One of the most popular is that lapetus once had a ring of debris ficiling it. Eventually, all of this debris fell, bit by bit, onto the moon. Because of the low gravity; it landed on the surface at a fingle ow speed. Instead of

We waited while the woman in front of us at the counter bought her tickets. She had three kids with her who were screaming and jumping around. With a string of tickets in one hand and a still-open wallet




It's been 178 days since Hans left Germany and me. Uncle thought it best to send him away to a safer place. Hans boarded a train for Holland with lots of other children.
