
I look out the window as she keeps talking. "SpaceNow started with a dream: to land a packet of gel on Mars, to grow plants in its soil."

"I'd read to him, but sometimes I'd just sit quietly, holding his hand. Watching him grimace with pain." She stares off into the hallway.


I fidget. I don't want to interrupt her reverie, but this is . a lot. I need to get out of here.



It was when my grandma died. She was the first one I






SAFETY FIRST

- Q. How do I dress babies safely?
- A. Between spitup and overflowing diapers, babies need their outilis changed pretty often to stay clean and sanitary. When you change an infant's clothes, you need to keep their head supported and choose loose clothes that won't suffocate them. Onesies with snaps are the easiest outilis to maneuver, so apt for these if you can. That way, you can open the onesie on a table and lay the baby on top of it. Gently move their arms and legs into the outilit and snap it closed. Ideally, they should have a fresh diaper too. (See page 45 for more on diapers.)
- 2. Plan chead. Rushing may agitate kids, decreasing your chances of success. Give yourself plenty of time to dress them. Factor in potential delays, like having to chase little ones around the house or having to find their black shose because who knows where they are. Also, plot some smooth moves to save time, such as untying and loosening shoes before asking kids to put them on.


found some evidence to support this theory. Measurements of the elements in the solar system reveal high concentrations of rare, radioactive elements Supernova explosions are the only way to create these radioactive elements so it is unlikely that the elements were already in the collapsing cloud. A nearby supernova is the most likely source. The presence of these radioactive elements is also a strong indication that a supernova started the collapse of the nebula that eventually produced our solar system.

As the moving molecules grew closer together, they occasionally bumped against one another. Each bump created a little heat. As the cloud condensed and molecules came closer together, it grew warmer. You can observe this heating effect yourself with a bicycle pump. When you push down on the pump handle the air inside the pump is compressed—it becomes denser. As this happens the pump will grow warmer, which you can feel if you touch it. A tire will also grow warm as you inflate it, for the same reason: the air inside is being compressed and made denser

The center of the cloud, where the gas and dust is densest, grew warm, then bot as more and more material fell into it. As the center of the cloud became denser, it pulled even more gas and dust into it. It was a cycle that increased rapidly. In just one year, a cloud of gas 2 trillion miles (3.2 trillion km) wide collapsed to only 200 million miles (322 million km)ten thousand times smaller. Soon it became hot enough-over 3,000°F (1,650°C)-to vaporize any remaining particles of ice or dust. At the same





he Statue of Liberty has become a symbol of hope, freedom and democracy to the rest of the world. Originally a gift from the country of France, a close ally, it stands on an island in New York Harbor where it has received millions of immigrants and tourists since it was dedicated in 1886. Engraved on it are the words of poet Emma Lazarus: "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free, The wretched refuse of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me, I lift my lamp beside the golden door!"

From 1892 to 1924 most immigrants who came from across the Atlantic Ocean passed the Statue of Liberty on the way to Ellis Island, the largest immigration station in the country. 12 million people passed through its doors during that time. They went on to start new lives, cultivate new farms, start new businesses and contribute to the general fabric of society. In short, they began their shot at living the American Dream. For others, Ellis Island was the "Island of Tears." It gained that nickname because not all who reached its shores were given entry. Families were separated, and many were turned away due




Such is the story of America- then and now- a nation that extends an extravagant invitation to those who wish to pursue a better life while at the same time restricting that invitation to others. But why have so many chosen to make the journey to a nation that may or may not

"THE AMERICAN DREAM"

It is quite possibly one of the most successful marketing slogans of all time, with millions every year striving for it, from outside our borders to within them, from immigrant to citizen. The phrase has become so intertwined with the nation that it is hard to believe it hasn't always been a part of the popular consciousness. Although it is impossible to know when it was first used, a 1916 Chicago Tribune article is considered to be one of the first. On February 7, it read, "If the American idea, the American hope, the American dream...are not worth fighting for to maintain and protect, they were not worth fighting for to establish. " Another early use of the term was in "Susan Lenox: Her Fall and Rise," a 1917 novel by David Graham Phillips. He states that "fashion and home magazines" have prepared people "for the possible rise of fortune" that "is the universal American dream and hope. " However, it is historian James Truslow Adams who in 1931 used it most prominently in his book "The Epic of America." In the preface he writes of that "American dream of a better, richer, and happier life for all our citizens of every rank which is the greatest contribution we have as yet made to the thought and welfare of the world. That dream or hope has been present from the start. Ever since we became an independent nation.

The phrase has become so commonplace that it may be considered cliché, but its ability to quickly capture the nation's ideals and spirit is precisely the reason it continues to have so much power. What does the American Dream mean to you? For many, it represents the opportunity to work hard, make money and have a better life than that of your

They needed to spread the word about their ideas, so Lichtash wrote an article for U.S. News & World Report about their goals. "True climate leadership can only occur with the support of Congress. It is clear that politics is all that stands in our way—the technologies and policies exist to ensure a better future," he wrote.


