


# The Science of Reading What is it?

- Phonemic Awareness: Focuses on recognizing and manipulating individual sounds in language
- Phonics Instruction: Emphasizes systematic teaching of letter-sound relationships
- Vocabulary Development: Highlights the importance of building oral and written vocabulary skills
- Fluency: Stresses the need for reading speed, accuracy, and expression
- **Comprehension Strategies**: Promotes techniques like summarization and questioning for better text understanding



# Decodable Text What is it?

According to the Florida Center for Reading Research, "Decodable text is text in which a high proportion of words (80%-90%) comprise lettersound correspondences that have already been taught. It is used for the purpose of providing practice with specific decoding skills and is a bridge between learning phonics and the application of phonics in independent reading."





# How to Engage Students with Decodable Books

- Promote Word Blending, Not Guessing: Encourage students to blend unfamiliar words rather than guessing
- Instantaneous Success: Provide students with the opportunity for immediate success
- Phonics Reinforcement: Reinforce classroom phonics skills through engaging storytelling
- Phonics for Fun Reading: Help students understand that phonics is the key to enjoying exciting books
- Independent Reading Joy: Empower students to experience the sheer joy of independent reading!





Research has shown that reading aloud to students improves comprehension (Duke & Pearson, 2008), vocabulary (Massaro, 2017), and fluency (Trelease, 2001). Read-alouds allow the teacher to model expert, fluent reading of the text.


Read-alouds allow students to concentrate on comprehension, acquiring new vocabulary, and developing phonemic awareness. This enables teachers to choose books above students' independent reading levels but within their listening abilities.
























# High/Low Books and The Science of Reading




reluctant readers.








- **Motivate Readers**: By offering engaging content and achievable challenges, high/low books help maintain or rekindle a student's motivation to read, which is essential for sustained progress.















# **Literacy is Equity**
